The programme aims to allow delegates to:

- ◆ Gain an in depth working knowledge of the models that are at the core of transpersonal coaching.
- ◆ Work creatively with the contradictions and complexity of work experience and meaning and purpose.
- ◆ Further develop the importance of values and ethics in the workplace and the contribution made by coaching.
- ◆ Elaborate and develop the techniques for working creatively with obstacles to performance in business: problems, challenges and setbacks.
- ◆ Develop the skills of working with conflict resolution in the coaching environment.
- ◆ Study the various methods of experiential intervention in coaching and how experiential techniques can be applied to the presenting coaching issue.

Learning will be through discussion and experiential exercises throughout.

Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this programme, delegates will be able to:

- ◆ Skilfully apply transpersonal principles within the coaching relationship.
- ◆ Readily employ the models of ‘service’ and ‘servant leadership’
- ◆ Use effectively the creative opportunities within business challenges and setbacks.
- ◆ Coach others using the personal and transpersonal dimensions of human experience.
- ◆ Be fully aware of their own process when coaching, and the complexity of intra-personal and interpersonal dynamics.
- ◆ Use a variety of methods and techniques to address business issues and make clear and discriminating decisions concerning the most appropriate interventions.
